 Reduce reliance on psychotropic medications 	
Discontinuation of pet therapy during COVID-19 pandemic	
 High risk of the virus spread through the pets and volunteers 	
 No alternative methods are being used in the nursing facility currently

Quality Improvement Objective

To understand the effect of discontinued pet therapy on nursing home residents. Eventually, find a rationale for starting a virtual pet therapy as an alternative.

The patients in Asbury height are being impacted negatively by the pet therapy discontinuation. Most of them want to have a virtual pet visit if pet therapy cannot be continued.

Methodology

- iii. How happy would you be to have virtual pet visit?
- iv. How happy you were after having the virtual pet visit?
- Would you prefer actual pet or virtual **V**. pet visit?

Summary

Study Design: Open-labeled study Participants: Nineteen patients in the nursing facility, Asbury height with a capacity for 92 residents

\Rightarrow Patient population: All patients age \geq 70 years old who agreed to participate and stayed in the nursing home at the time of

How much they loved and now miss the therapy pet?

vi. Do you like virtual pet? Yes=Y, No=N

Outcomes measured: Numeric rating scale of 1(most negative) to 5(most positive)

Figure 1. Q1 to Q4 Survey Responses





Figure 1. Q5 and Q6 Survey Responses



Discussion

- Demonstrated that virtual pet visit can be an alternative to pet therapy
- The participants are negatively impacted by pet therapy discontinuation
- Most of the participants want to have a virtual pet visit if pet therapy cannot be continued
- The patients still prefer actual pet visit compare to the virtual pet visit
- Strengths
 - Used numeric rating scale which can be easily applicable in other settings
- Limitations
 - Small number of patients participated in the survey
- Next steps
 - Continue virtual pet visit while actual pet visit is prohibited due to COVID-19
 - F/U with the impact of virtual pet visit during COVID-19 Pandemic
